

### Working Families Index 2022


- Comprehensive survey of parents covering:

  - childcare arrangements


 2022 Index, surveyed 2,806 UK working parents between November 4-19th 2021





### How parents are working








### Gaps in support

 Absence of support between paid maternity period and 15/30 hours entitlement at 3 years of age



- Limited coverage:
  - 30 hours across 38 weeks
  - Accessible the term after the child's third birthday

Additional costs



#### Solutions

- Current government proposal on ratio change?
- Greater funding for childcare and early years education. Reframe the discussion around childcare as an investment
- Policy reform on flexible working and culture change so that flex is easier for people to access
